What's in it for me?

Joining INARC will allow you to connect with other professionals who are facing the same challenges than you are at your site/center/hospital. But as they come from different perspectives, and with differents contexts, meeting them will allow you to improve your own practice, and increase your capabilities to think outside the box! What we have observed at INARC is that the richest conversations usually happen between small centers and large centers, when large centers may provide advice on how to optimize certain tasks to save time, and smaller centers on how to be very ressourful with less ressources. INARC events also offer lectures, training on outcome measures, workshops, and contribute to our evergoing education and training.



Being an INARC member

Who will I meet during INARC meetings and events?

During INARC events you will meet professionals from care and research teams, coming from North America, Europe and South America. We are currently working on relationships and memberships establising with professionals from Africa and Asia, and if you know of teams who might be interested please let us know of them! All events are run in English, but English is not the 1st language of most of our members. As our goal is to exchange, we ask every INARC member to leave their concerns on their abilities in English at the door! This allows for all our members to be comfortables during INARC meetings, for it to be a judgment-free zone when it comes to speaking in English.

Can I be sponsored to attend INARC events?

Each country has options to support and sponsor care and research professionals to attend conferences and meetings, and we encourage you to investigate this within your own networks. However, if you are coming from a country with very limited ressources and are struggling to attend an INARC event, we encourage you to reach out to us and we will see if we can find a solution.

INARC Day

- Every year en marge of ENCALS, INARC organizes a full day of satellite meeting. This year, it will take place on June 20th, on the Karolinska Instituet (KI) campus, room Franklinsalen. The topic of this year's meeting is "End of Life in ALS".
